
BLACKTOWN SINHALA SCHOOL PROSPECTUS 2018


Sri Lankan Community in Australia

These schools play a vital role under the direct supervision of Sinhalese Cultural Forum of NSW to retain Sinhala culture and language proficiency among Sri Lankan-Australian kids for today, tomorrow and the future generations to come.

Blacktown Sinhala School is committed to creating a vibrant, dynamic and a welcoming environment for the children of Sri Lankan heritage to engage, learn and embrace a lifelong love for the Sinhala language and Sri Lankan culture.

The school adopts a scaled teaching methodology through our qualified and dedicated panel of trained teachers. The curriculum is developed and managed by the Sinhalese Cultural Forum of NSW and confirms to the guidelines of the Education Department of NSW and Community Languages Schools Program.

- Operated in the The Ponds High School (180 Riverbank Dr) on every Sunday from 10.00am to 12.30pm.
- An average of 110 students are currently enrolled in a structured classroom based study program (Kindergarten to Year 6) with a staff of 8 teachers.
- · Curriculum is targeted towards improving Sinhala language Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking skills.
- Our children participate in extracurricular activities in speech, singing, dancing, drama, art and craft throughout the year gathering experiences in comprehension, presentation and organizing skills.

Some important events from our annual calendar

Bakmaha Rangana An annual cultural extravaganza organised by the Sinhalese Cultural Forum of NSW, celebrating the Sri Lankan New Year festivities. The event has undoubtedly progressed to become the most prestigious cultural event for the Sri Lankan community of Sydney. Students of Blacktown Sinhala School take pride in participating in this grand event to kindle their talents and perform in front of a large audience.

Sinhala New Year Celebrations

New Year in Sri Lanka or the Sinhala Tamil New Year (Aluth Avurudhu) usually falls on April 13th or 14th every year. According to Sinhalese astrology, New Year begins when the sun moves from Meena Rashiya (the house of Pisces) to Mesha Rashiya (the house of Aries). It also marks the end of the harvest and spring thus creating the most expected and largely celebrated cultural event in Sri Lanka. We at Blacktown Sinhala School organise New Year celebrations to let our little ones feel the warmth of cultural values and get hands on experience in participating in them.
